

The Friends of The Hendreds – Bonus Ball Rules

The bonus ball competition will be a regular fundraiser for The Hendreds School. The Bonus Ball co-ordinator acting on behalf of The Friends of The Hendreds is Niki Cockett.

59 balls are available for sale at £1 per week, during term time. There is no restriction on the number of balls an individual player may select.

A poster will be displayed on the notice board each week detailing the winning number, the prize winner, the amount won and how much will be in the prize pot for the following week.

PAYMENT:

Payment will be collected termly in advance. If a person's ball is drawn and the ball has not been paid for, then s/he will not be eligible to collect the winnings.

Balls can be sold to anyone over the age of 16

PRIZE MONEY:

Half of each week's takings will be put in the prize money pot. The other half will be retained by The Friends of The Hendreds.

The winning bonus ball number will be taken from each Saturday's National Lottery Draw commencing on Saturday 9 January 2016.

The holder of the number drawn will win the prize for that week.

If the winning ball has not been bought, then half of the prize money will be retained by The Friends of The Hendreds and half will be added to the prize money pot.

Additional Rules

1. The Bonus Ball shall run each term. It will not run during school holidays.
2. One person shall be allocated to each number and each number costs £1 per week – multiple ball allocation is permitted.
3. The winning ball shall be that of the bonus ball that is drawn in the National Lottery draw on Saturday nights.
4. For a ball to be eligible to win a prize, payment must have been received in advance
5. If a person's ball is drawn and money has not been paid for, then he/she will not be eligible to collect the winnings and a rollover will incur.
6. Continued non payment for a ball will result in the ball being re-sold at the start of the next term
7. The winner will be notified by email and the co-ordinator will organise the delivery of the winnings.
8. If more than 59 people want to join the scheme a waiting list will operate.
9. Balls are allocated on a first come first served basis.
10. The co-ordinator reserves the right to refuse payout if one or more of the rules above are not complied with and their word is final.
11. The bonus ball co-ordinator is not paid but may enter the competition if they wish.
